THE PROPERTY WE ALMOST BOUGHT IN 2000





WHUSTLER

"BIGHT"

A "bight" is made by folding a piece of rope so that the two parts lie alongside each other. When tied near the rope's end, the parts will be the 'Tail lying beside the Standing End. A bight can be used to finish many knots – making them easy to untie by just pulling the tail. The term "Bight" does not imply a "Loop" (which is when a rope forms a partial circle with the ends crossing each other).



The blue rope is half-hitched through and around a bight of the red rope in this sheet bend.



A figure eight knot tied in the bight results in a figure-eight loop.



The final tuck of this slipped buntline hitch is made with a bight rather than the end, making it easier to release after tightening.



An overhand knot tied in the bight results in an overhand loop.



The bights, in the case of this Turk's head knot, are the scallops along the perimeter of the knot.



The alpine butterfly knot is a knot which is tied in the bight and forms a reliable fixed loop.



In the tying of a marlinspike hitch, a bight of the standing part is snagged through the loop.



The **bowline on a bight** forms two fixed loops in the middle of a rope.
